PHYSICIAN AND PROFESSOR


Dr. Robert Schwab has had a long and varied career in medicine. Currently the Chief Medical Officer at Texas Health Presbyterian Hospital Allen, he came to North Texas in 2010 from Kansas City, where he served as Chief of Emergency Medicine at Truman Medical Center as well as a Palliative Medicine physician. Previously, he served as professor and chair of the Department of Emergency Medicine and professor of Medical Humanities at the University of Missouri-Kansas City School of Medicine. Originally from Virginia, he graduated from medical school at the University of Virginia.

AUTHOR AND SPEAKER

Dr. Schwab is an author and a speaker, with a passion for the ways in which the study of the humanities can benefit those who are pursuing a career in healthcare (and their patients). The humanities, he believes, by asking us to confront the human condition and experience life from a variety of viewpoints, are instrumental in helping disease-fighters also become healers. The arts, humanities and self-care are also part of his "prescription" to help med students and practicing physicians avoid the growing problem of burnout, depression and suicide.

Dr. Schwab has lectured around the country and is a sought-after speaker at universities, medical schools, conferences, hospitals and other medical-related gatherings for staff, students and the community. His talks cover a variety of topics perfect for students, physicians and more.

Dr. Schwab is the author of two published novels, with a third in the works. *Holy Water* is about a young physician's transformative experience during a medical convention that forces him to reexamine his motivations for pursuing medicine and to redefine, for himself, what it means to be a physician. *Back Side of a Hurricane* is a novel about fathers and their children, and about the wisdom of sitting still when chaos swirls around you.
